HAND SANITISER

GENERAL SAFETY

Contact us for information and advice on the suitability and safety of this type of equipment.

There is a risk of injury if you do not follow the instructions printed in this guide.

This equipment should only be set up by a competent adult who has read and understood these instructions. Anyone with a temporary or permanent disability should seek expert advice before using the equipment.

Ensure the unit is sited on a level surface and does not cause an obstruction. Do not site the unit near a heat source or in direct sunlight.

Never set up the unit if you are ill, tired or under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Check the equipment before use, if it shows signs of damage, request a replacement.

The unit dispenses an alcohol based hand sanitiser which is available as a sale item.

NOTE: Some units are battery operated which are included with the unit.

Set up the unit is sited on a level surface and does not cause an obstruction.

Once in position, unlock the front cover using the key provided.

Once open, take out the sanitiser tank and fill with sanitiser to the marked line then close and secure the front cover, retaining the key in a safe place. The unit is now ready to use.

NB: The hand sanitiser gel is for external use only- to be rubbed into the hands. If it gets into the eyes or is ingested, seek medical advice immediately.

NB: Alcohol based hand sanitiser gel is Flammable so keep away from naked flames & any heat source.

Re-fill the unit as required. Clean and sanitise the unit and drip tray on a regular basis.

NOTE: Our auto dispense units come complete with batteries, which are situated behind the front cover. These auto-dispense units have an in-built dispense activation sensor, so NO TOUCH is required, simply place your hands below the unit and the sanitiser will be dispensed – Simply rub the gel into hands.

MAINTENANCE & CLEANING

Remove the batteries and drain any remaining sanitiser gel if the unit is to be unused for a long period of time.

Do not immerse the unit in water, clean with a damp cloth.

Do not use abrasives or corrosive chemicals to clean the unit.

Keep dirt and dust out of the sanitiser tank.

Keep away from fire and heat sources.
